Berea Tax Levy and Gender Charter Amendment

Berea, Ohio

The tax levy raises around \$365,000 per year at a cost of about \$25 for \$100,000 house. The levy is used to fund city operations.

The Gender Charter Amendment simply clarifies that terms are meant to be gender neutral.
